Dear Family & Friends of Meals on Wheels of Central Maryland



Fifty years ago, two women had a vision. Ernestine McCollum and Beatrice Strouse knew that even in this land of plenty, homebound senior citizens often went to bed hungry. They wanted to find a way to end senior hunger. If these seniors couldn't get out to shop and were no longer able to prepare food on their own, why couldn't meals be brought to them?

In October 1960, their dream became a reality when a small group of volunteers from the Baltimore Section of the National Council of Jewish Women began delivering meals to 10 clients.

It was the beginning of a program that has spread throughout the metropolitan Baltimore area and beyond – Meals on Wheels of Central Maryland. Today, and every weekday (including holidays), our corps of over 2,200 volunteers will deliver a hot lunch and a cold supper to 1,500 homebound individuals.

These are impressive statistics, but the true story is in the people we serve. They are our parents, our neighbors, and our disabled friends. Because of the nutritious food we deliver, their lives are healthier. Because of the warmth and friendship we bring with their meals, their lives are enriched.

And the fuel that keeps our wheels rolling continues to be the corps of 2,200 volunteers whose dedication continues to amaze. During the past year, they volunteered 83,438 hours and drove 648,349 miles – a value to Meals on Wheels of \$2,388,040!

As we face the next 50 years, we know that the population of seniors is growing. They are telling us that they want to continue living at home as independently as possible. We know that we must grow to meet that need.

During the past year, our Board of Directors has been hard at work on a strategic plan, developing our vision for the future. We are determined to double the number of people we serve each day by 2020. With the continued assistance of our volunteers and generous donors, we plan to do our part in achieving the national goal of ending senior hunger.

50 YEARS OF SERVICE



Out of the Blitz:

During the blitz bombing of London in World War II, thousands were left homeless and without resources for buying and preparing food. Concerned women conceived the idea of preparing meals in community kitchens and delivering them by volunteers. Thus began the Women's Royal Volunteer Service and Meals on Wheels. The idea spread to this country when the first program was established in 1954 at the Lighthouse, a settlement house in Northeast Philadelphia.

In 1959, Mrs. Ernestine McCollum of the Maryland Home Economics Association and Mrs. Beatrice Strouse, representing the Baltimore Section of the National Council of Jewish Women, traveled to Philadelphia to observe how the Lighthouse prepared and delivered meals. They shared the conviction that nutritious meals for the aging, convalescent, and disabled were a genuine need in Baltimore. What Philadelphia had done, Baltimore could do better!



Wheels Start Rolling:

On October 3, 1960 under Mrs. McCollum's professional guidance, and with Mrs. Strouse as chairman, volunteers first packed and delivered a hot meal and a cold meal to each of 10 clients on one route out of Levindale Hebrew Geriatric Center and Hospital.

In 1962, at a special meeting of the Chesapeake Synod Council, Dr. Archibald Chalfont presented a plan to open a Meals on Wheels kitchen at a Presbyterian Church. Volunteers from several Presbyterian Churches joined together to serve the homebound from the kitchen at Brown Memorial.

Meals Programs Organize:

In October 1964, following the opening of Lutheran Social Services' Kitchen at St. Paul's Lutheran Church, a coordinating committee was organized to promote development of the home delivered meal program, set standards for service and provide guidance to new groups beginning the service. This group subsequently became the Baltimore Metropolitan Meals on Wheels Committee, an unincorporated federation of the four independently organized home delivered meal projects sponsored by the Baltimore County Commission on Aging, Lutheran Social Services, the Baltimore Section of the National Council of Jewish Women and the Presbytery of Baltimore.

The committee was incorporated as Baltimore Metropolitan Meals on Wheels in 1967. A grant obtained through the federal Older Americans Act and administered by Lutheran Social Services of Maryland supported the establishment of a central intake office in downtown Baltimore. Mrs. Peggy Sheeler, R.N. accepted the position of Coordinator of the Central

Intake Office. A further reorganization took place in 1969. Mrs. Sheeler, became the first Meals on Wheels Executive Director, and a Board of Directors was appointed consisting of representatives from funding agencies, kitchens and the community.

Meals on Wheels Arrive in Counties:

In 1973, Meals on Wheels began to expand beyond the Baltimore City and County boundaries with the establishment of a Carroll County Kitchen. In 1974, kitchens were opened in Harford County, and St. Martin's Lutheran Church in Annapolis; and the organization became known as Meals on Wheels of Central Maryland, Inc. Since then, kitchens were formed in the Glen Burnie area and Howard County (1975).

Preparing for the future:

Recognizing the need of a rapidly growing elderly population and the limitations of a network of small kitchens, in 1982, the Board of Directors of Meals on Wheels of Central Maryland charged an ad hoc Long Range Planning Committee to investigate the concept of centralizing food preparation and packaging activities at a single site. Studies showed that such a site would enable Meals on Wheels to double the number of meals prepared, contain operating costs and enhance quality control. The Board decided to proceed with the project. The next several years were spent in defining the scope of the project and planning its implementation.

It was determined that such an ambitious endeavor for a grass-roots organization would require a partnership of public and private resources. In 1989, the Maryland General Assembly passed a Bond Bill in the amount of \$500,000 to provide a matching grant for the Central Kitchen. In early 1990, local attorney Ron Shapiro

chaired a committee charged with raising \$500,000 in matching funds from foundations and corporations. Within four short months, the goal was surpassed and the State Grant secured.

Later that same year, a site for the Central Kitchen was selected and plans were begun for converting a former supermarket/diesel school on South Haven Street in Baltimore into a state-of-the-art commissary with modern administrative offices.

While the project was well on its way, additional funding was necessary to see it through. In 1991, the Harry and Jeanette Weinberg Foundation joined the Partnership in Caring by pledging a \$500,000 grant. Renovation work began on the site; and in January 1992, ten years after its inception, the dream became a reality when Meals on Wheels moved into its new home.



Meals on Wheels Today:

Since its beginning in 1960, the backbone of Meals on Wheels has always been the dedicated corps of volunteers who make it all possible. Today, 2,200 volunteers in the Meals on Wheels of Central Maryland program are actively involved in packing and delivering meals to the homebound. Each weekday, a hot lunch and a cold supper are delivered to approximately 1,500 clients throughout the central Maryland area.

These volunteers provide much more than just a meal. Often the volunteer who delivers the meals is the only social contact the client may have that day and can provide a vital link for the client with needed medical care and other services. Volunteers forge close relationships with the clients they serve, making the most of their short daily visit. Often they are able to spot deterioration in the client's health and report it so that medical attention can be given. It is not at all uncommon for a physician to report that a Meals on Wheels volunteer has saved someone's life.

Ending Senior Hunger:

As Meals on Wheels of Central Maryland enters its next 50 years, we remain committed to feeding those who cannot feed themselves. Our Board of Directors has initiated a strategic plan that calls for doubling the number of homebound people we serve by the year 2020. This will take a tremendous effort on the part of our volunteers, staff, and, especially, those individuals, businesses and foundations who provide the financial support that keep our wheels turning.

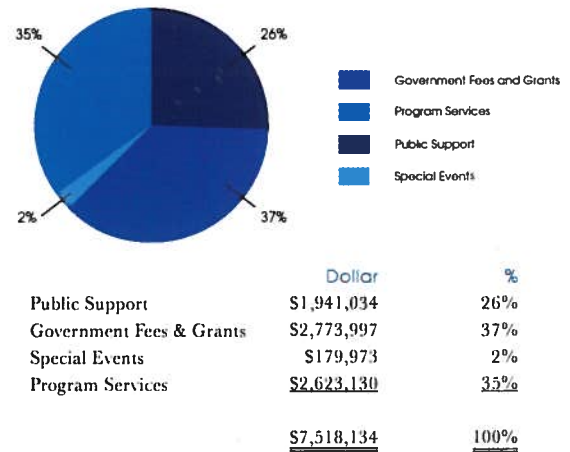

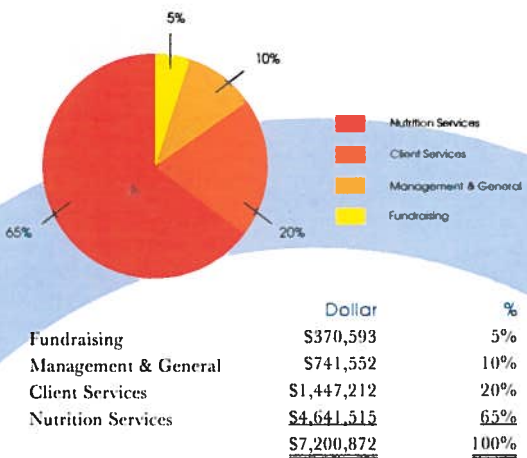
Operating Revenue 2010
